Today, we celebrate the **Twenty-eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time**. Our gospel passage is **Matthew 22:1-14**.

In our Gospel reading this week from the book of Matthew, Jesus told another parable to the chief priests and elders. In the parable, Jesus taught that the kingdom of heaven is like “a king who gave a wedding feast for his son.” Many guests refused the invitation. The one guest who came was dressed improperly and disrespected his host, the king.



Did you know that **WE** are invited? Every day of our lives, Jesus invites us to spend time with him in prayer. Through the gift of the Resurrection, God invited us to have eternal life with Him in heaven, through our faith in his son, Jesus Christ. How do we respond to God's invitation in our lives?
