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

Today we celebrate **Palm Sunday of the Lord's Passion**. We actually read from the Gospel twice today. At the beginning of the Mass we read from Mark 11 during the Procession with Palms. In this Gospel passage, we witness Jesus' triumphant entry into Jerusalem. In Mark 14-15, we proclaim the Gospel of Jesus' "Passion" – his suffering and death on the cross to save each of us. He loved each of us so very much that he gave his life for us. As we journey through Holy Week, we witness this love and the glory of Jesus' resurrection at Easter.

We have one more week to journey through Lent until we celebrate Easter. Make this a special time of giving and prayer. This week, make time to read today's Gospel account of Christ's passion together as a family, taking time to ponder how much Jesus loves each of us.
