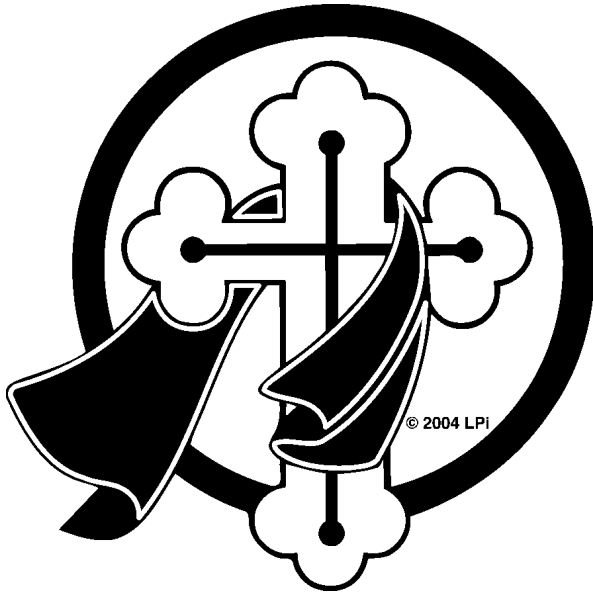

Our gospel passage for this week is from **Matthew 5:1-12a**. This week, we celebrate the **Solemnity of All Saints**.

In today's gospel passage from Matthew, Jesus went up a mountain and began to teach his disciples. This famous passage of Matthew's gospel is part of an important teaching called "**The Sermon on the Mount**". In this very first section, Jesus taught his followers "**the Beatitudes**", a list of eight blessings that would help his followers to lead a holy life.

Today, we celebrate "**All Saints Day**" (*known formally as The Solemnity of All Saints*) and remember all of the saints who have given their lives to follow Jesus and to teach others about him. We are each called—in our own way—to become "saints". Reading and praying

about the Beatitudes can help us find our own way to better know, love and serve God.
