Today, we celebrate the 25th Sunday in Ordinary Time. We read from Luke 16:1-13.

In Luke's gospel reading for today, Jesus told his disciples a parable about a dishonest steward. The steward's master had decided to terminate his position because he had not taken good care of the master's property. He went on to try to protect himself, so that when his employment ended he would have people who would help him.

Jesus taught his disciples, *"No servant can serve two masters. He will either hate one and love the other, or be devoted to one and despise the other. You cannot serve both God and mammon."*

We have to decide who we want to serve in this life – God, or the world around us. Choosing to serve God means that we will face challenges, choices and sacrifices. But God's love for us and the promises God gives us will sustain us.
