Today we celebrate the Second Sunday of Ordinary Time. Last week marked the beginning of Jesus' public ministry and this week we see Jesus perform what is believed to be his first miracle at a wedding feast in Cana.

At the wedding, Jesus challenges his Mother Mary when she asks him to help the host of the wedding when they run out of wine. Jesus questions her request saying, it is "not yet his time." Still, Mary says to the servers, "Do whatever he tells you." They listen, and the miracle of water turning into wine occurs (a wine so fine that the head waiter inquires why they weren't serving this wine first)! In this story we see how *Mary petitions Jesus to help and Jesus listens.*

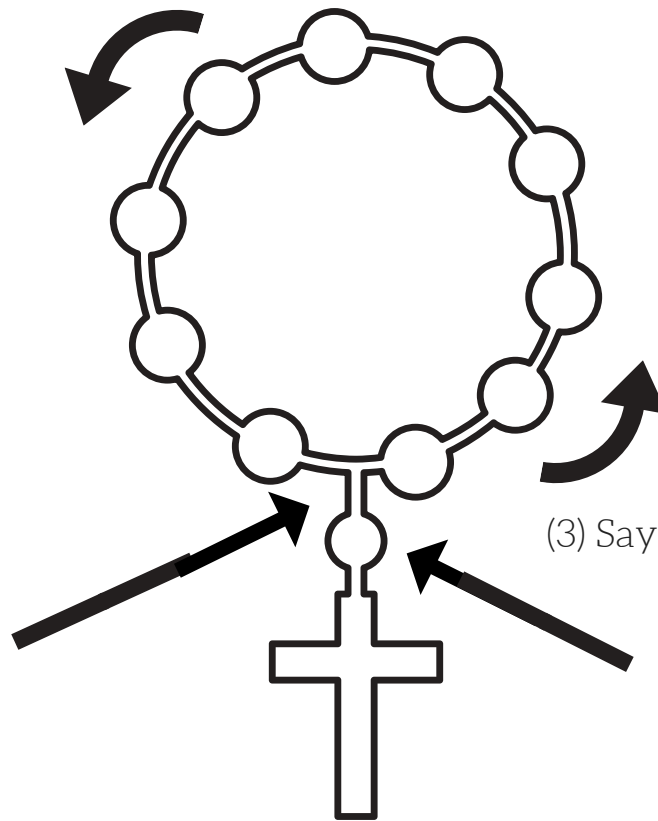
